## Health Center Update

You may wish to apply sunscreen to your child before coming to school. Sunscreen may not be applied in school without a doctor's order. Encourage your child to drink extra fluids throughout the day as the weather gets warmer. Send in a water bottle with their snack/lunch.

As you know, we live in a tick-prevalent area. Ticks thrive is wooded areas, tall grasses, and thick brush. Ticks can transmit disease. Most common in our region is Lyme Disease, caused by the Deer tick. Here are some ways to protect yourself: 1. wear long sleeved shirts, pants 2. wear light colored clothes so a tick is more visible. 3. use insect repellent 4. stay on trails and away from brush 5. perform frequent "tick checks" 6. bathe as soon as possible after being outdoors
